FATHER BRIAN HIGGINS (COACH, TEACHER, PRINCIPAL, MENTOR)

No one is certain if Father Brian Higgins C.S.B. actually coined the phrase or not. What is certain is that he is credited with making it part of the SMC mythos.

During one memorable pep rally in the 1980s, Higgy returned to St. Mary's and was invited to say a *few* words - a difficult task for any Irishman but an impossible one for Father Brian. The older staff members squirmed as he went on stage in front of a student body who had hardly any idea of who he was. He started out his talk like Father Flanagan of Boys' Town and began to explain the tradition of St. Mary's. Slowly, the shuffling in the crowd diminished. He spoke of the history of our struggle through years of adversity, low budgets and lack of athletic equipment. He reminded them how fortunate they were to live in a city on a river and in a school named after the Blessed Virgin. He reminded them of the sacrifice that parents, teachers' staff and former students made to just keep the school running, not to mention being able to cobble up enough equipment to develop a football program.

Brian Philip Higgins was born in 1926 and celebrated the 50th Anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood last June. He has been a Basilian since August 15, 1947.

He has been a St. Mary's man since the day he walked into SMC in the late 1960s. Coach has been a teacher, and principal at St. Mary's College as well as St. Charles in Sudbury, Windsor Assumption and St. Mike's in Toronto.

Father Brian is currently living at Henry Carr Farm, a Basilian residence in Beeton Ontario where, up until last year, he was still doing chaplaincy work in Toronto area Catholic high schools. His Sundays are still filled with saying Mass at area churches.

Those who were lucky enough to be on road trips with Higgy will recall how each trip - no matter what length - began with saying the rosary. Afterwards he would share his philosophy on kids and education - "We can only teach them as much as their parents will let us"; coaching - "We didn't lose, we just ran out of time".

Father Higgins will be an honored guest at the SMC 50th Anniversary next Thanksgiving. He may even be coaxed into making an appearance at the Alumni Golf Tournament in the spring, as a warm-up to the formal festivities.
